We are proud of our inclusivity here at SIS here are a few words from Ms Hiba our Head of Inclusion:




What is INCLUSION?

The word Inclusion means the action or state of being included within a group or structure. In a school setting, this word means that students, no matter what level they are compared to their peers, no matter if they have a disability, no matter if they are an English Language Learner, etc., that they are in the same classroom setting as other learners their age, and they are being exposed to the same curriculum and the same standards as their peers. Inclusion in the classroom means that the students receive the support they need to be successful. It means that the students are given work that is at their level and adopted or modified if needed.

Inclusion is students feeling like they belong with the rest of the students in their classroom and feeling accepted. It means that no student is sent outside of their classroom because of his or her ability. Inclusion means that all students are set up to succeed.

Inclusion is not sending students to different places for the entire school day because they are too low, or they don't speak the same language, or because they would fit better somewhere else. Although students may need to see a specialist to work on a skill through intervention and leave the classroom for brief period/s throughout the school day to do this, they go back to their general classroom to learn with their peers for the rest of the school day, where they receive help if needed and complete work that is at their level.
